

At least two days prior to your procedure, someone from the surgery center will call you before your procedure to confirm your arrival time and review information regarding your procedure.

PLEASE BE ADVISED OF THE FOLLOWING:

It is your responsibility to contact your insurance company to learn whether a specific procedure is covered and if it will be applied to a deductible. Some insurance plans have riders and underwriting on the plan that may or may not cover any or all of the procedure. We want you to be aware and understand the specifics of your insurance coverage. We are happy to provide you with the codes that could be used when submitting your claim to the insurance company.

VERY IMPORTANT

There are three (3) entities involved that will send a bill following your procedure.

- 1. FACILITY: Mid-State Endoscopy or Ascension Saint Thomas Rutherford
- 2. OneGI:
 - Dr. Sunil Sarvaria
 - Pathology (if any specimens are collected during procedure)
- 3. ANESTHESIA

Anesthesia, pathology, and physician charges are filed with insurance for determination of additional patient financial responsibility.

SuFlave Instructions

Medication has been electronically sent into your pharmacy, PLEASE pick up within 5-7 days.

PLEASE drink the required liquid to ensure a good clean out.

The day prior to your procedure, you will be on CLEAR LIQUIDS all day long.

DATE:

6PM the night before your procedure you will start your prep for your colonoscopy.

You will complete 1 bottle of 32 ounces of Suflave in one hour, you should drink 8 ounces every 15 minutes.

After completion of the Suflave bottle, you need to drink a and additional 16 ounces of clear liquids.

Continue clear liquids till bedtime to ensure a good hydration.

6PM prior to your procedure you will start the second part of your prep.

DATE:

Complete the second bottle of 32 ounces of Suflave in one hour, you should drink 8 ounces every 15 minutes.

After completion of the Suflave bottle, you need to drink an additional 16 ounces of clear liquids.

NOTHING BY MOUTH FOUR HOURS PRIOR TO YOUR PROCEDURE, including gum, minutes, candy, cough, drops, and water.

No usage of marijuana, cocaine, recreational drugs, or alcohol within 24 hours of your procedure. Anesthesia will not sedate you if you have consumed any of these in 24 hours.

Daily

- Rybeisus (semaglutide)
- Victoza (liraglutide)
- Saxenda (liraglutide)
- Byetta (exenatide)
- Adlyxin (Lixisenatide)

Weekly

- Ozempic (semaglutide)
- Wegovy (semaglutide)
- Trulicity (dulaglutide)
- Bydureon (exenatide)
- Mounjaro (tirzepatide)

Hold GLP-1 agonists on the DAY of procedure for patients who take the medication DAILY.

Hold GIP-1 agonists a WEEK prior to the procedure for the patients who take the medication WEEKLY.
